Jesus Loves Children

Read Mark 10: 13-16

Look for pictures of people in magazines, books, on the computer, iPad, phone, TV, and ask your child to point to the children they see. Say, "Jesus loves children."

Children's Band

Let your child choose an instrument if you have some, if not they can clap their hands. Say, "Jesus loves all the children so let's sing and shake an instrument."

Walk around the room and ask the children to walk with you while playing instruments/clapping their hands. Stop and say "I have something to tell you. Jesus loves children!"

Coloring Page; Jesus Loves The Children

As your child colors the coloring page point to the picture of Jesus and say, "This is Jesus. Can you point to the children? Can you point to Jesus? The children are happy because Jesus loves children. Does Jesus love you? ... Yes! Jesus loves you and Jesus loves me."

Message: Hope you're having a nice week and getting outside a bit. Ms. Nancy and I love children and we love you! ❤️❤️❤️

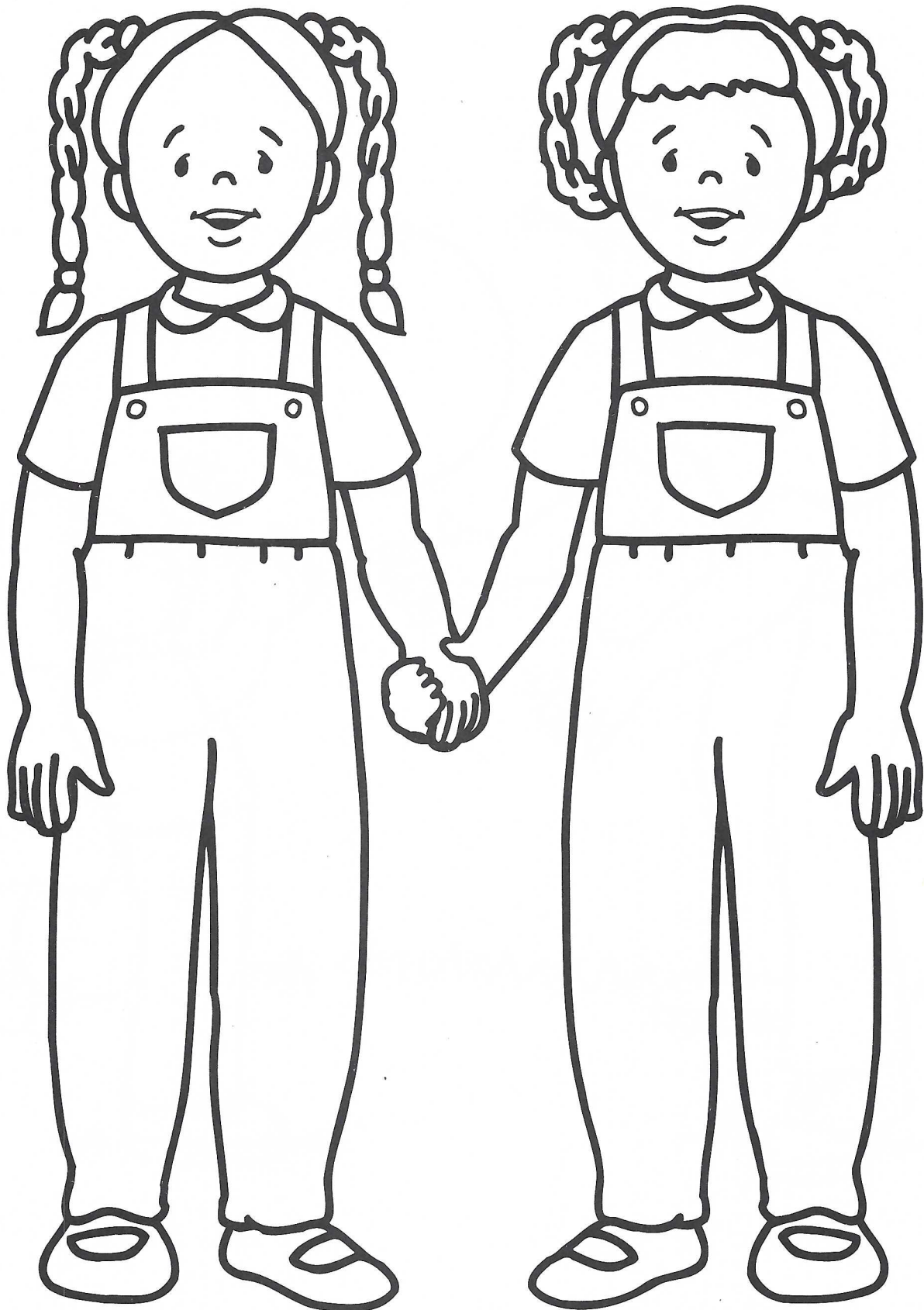
