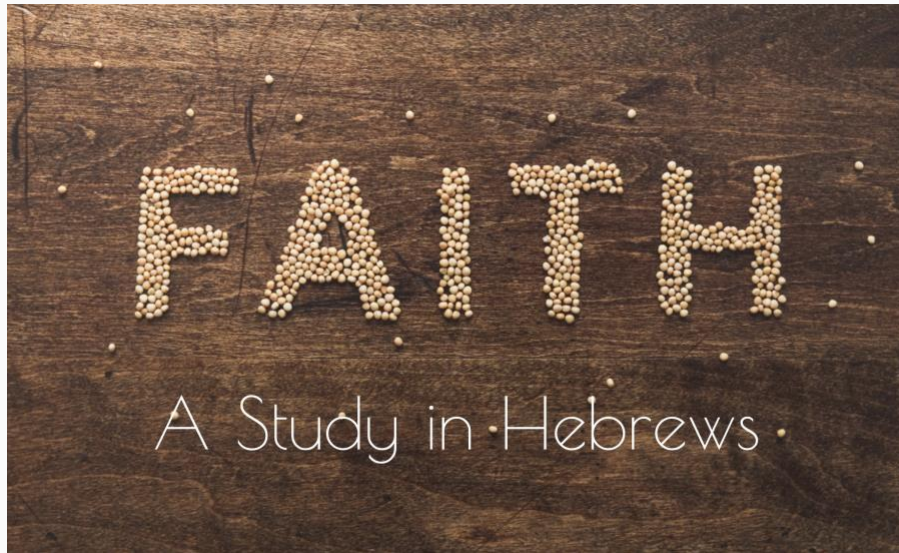


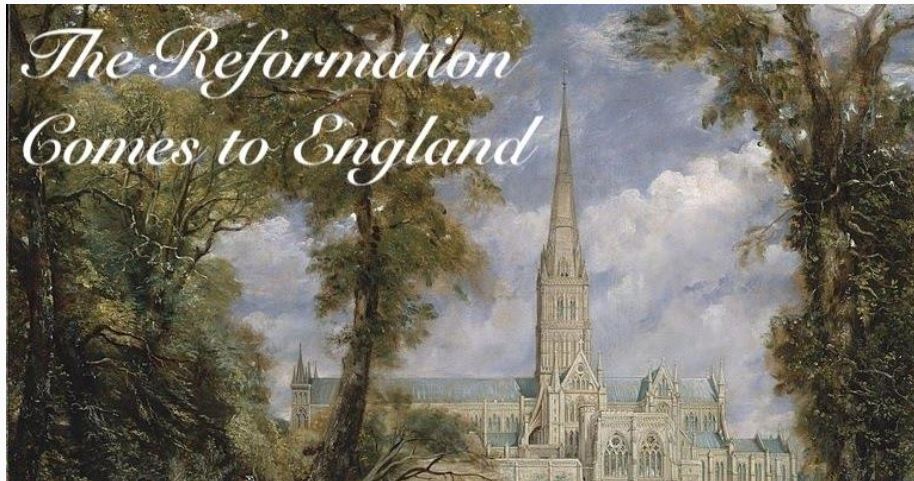

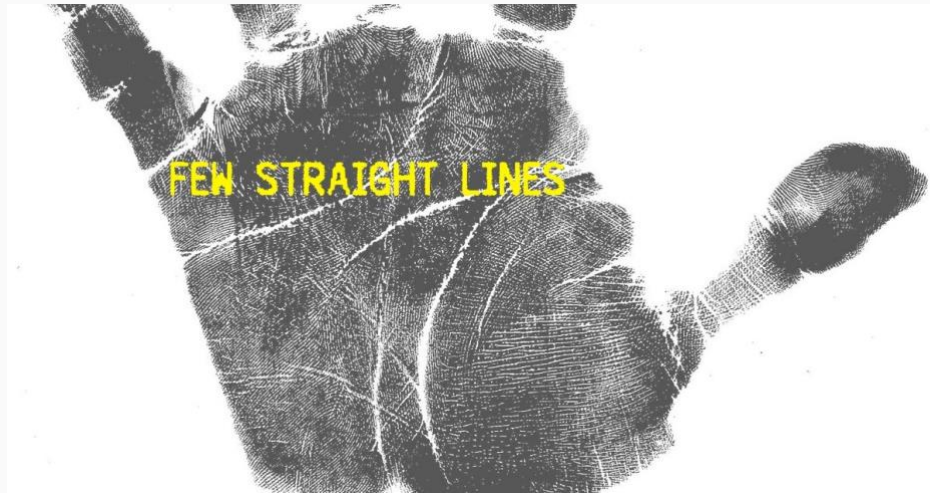

The Reformation Comes to England The Reformation in England was a tumultuous affair, brought about through political motivations and subject to the changing religious adherence of various monarchs. For the English people this was confusing and difficult. Were there seven sacraments, or two? Should they genuflect before a saint's statue, or were images idolatrous? Could priests and bishops be married, or was celibacy a requirement?

This class will trace the history of the English church from 1500-1700, with particular attention to how lay people experienced the changes, and to the theological and political power struggles that went on within the church. As Christians in America navigate how our faith should inform public policy and civic identity, what role the church should play in shaping government, and vice versa, we have a lot to learn from those English Christians who have gone before us.
