Stewardship Update **Giving Status**

We are pleased to report that operating budget giving for 2019 was at \$866,659 (out of \$850,000), total boiler giving is at \$54,385 (out of \$100,000), and total missions giving is at \$199,990 (out of \$199,957). Thanks be to God! (Note that these are not necessarily the final figures for 2019, as any checks mailed and postmarked 12/31/2019 have not been received yet, and year-end accounting cross-checks must be performed.)

Audit Status

We are pleased to report that the audit was completed several weeks ago, covering financial activities through 12/31/2018. Accountants' Conclusion: "Based on our review, we are not aware of any material modifications that should be made to the accompanying financial statements in order for them to be in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America." - breakfast items: jam/jelly, cereal (hot & cold), pancake/waffle mixes, syrup
- canned goods: chili, hearty soup, canned meats, baked beans
- snacks: granola bars, raisins, crackers, pudding
- dry goods: coffee, tea, cocoa, rice and other grains, pasta, baking mixes
- condiments: mayonnaise, salad dressing, mustard, ketchup, sauces, oils
- personal care items: soap, shampoo, deodorant, toothbrushes/toothpaste
